1. About the role

Applicants are sought to engage with the Council's Qualification & Learning working group to engage in the following activities:

- ▶ research and attribute a minimum standard of knowledge and skills to each of [the 16 specialisms](#) based on CyBOK topic acronyms and CII Sec skills group and levels
- ▶ allocate skills and knowledge standards for each specialism across the three UK Cyber Security Council registration grades
- ▶ evaluate the exam syllabuses of qualifications and certifications to confirm their attribution to one (or more) specialism(s) at one of the three UK Cyber Security Council registration grades

2. Key accountabilities

The successful candidate(s) will:

- ▶ develop and apply a valid, reliable, consistent methodology to the attribution of CyBOK knowledge areas and CII Sec skills areas to the Council's [16 cyber security specialisms](#)
- ▶ build relationships with and ensure process buy-in from key internal and external stakeholders
- ▶ identify, quantify and record feedback on the mapping and evaluation process and make recommendations for new/amended specialisms

3. Person specification

Essential

- ▶ cyber security teaching or training experience
- ▶ knowledge of CyBOK
- ▶ knowledge of CIISec
- ▶ knowledge of qualification and certification regulated frameworks including RQF, SCQF, CQFW, CCEA

Desirable

- ▶ cyber security skills frameworks knowledge including, but not limited to NICE, NIST, SFIA
- ▶ experience developing learning materials, assessments grading and levelling.
- ▶ cyber security careers experience
- ▶ quality and assurance experience
- ▶ diversity and inclusion experience

Other skills

- ▶ excellent written and verbal communication skills
- ▶ excellent analysis skills
- ▶ attention to detail
- ▶ confident with data and data analysis
- ▶ skilled stakeholder management
- ▶ experience leading/co-ordinating a virtual team
