Nature of Work	Hands-on development of documentation and guidance.	Review, advise on, and endorse contextualisations, processes, and audit results.

Expertise Required	Subject matter expertise in a specific cyber security specialism. Familiarity with professional registration frameworks.	Authoritative expertise in a specialism. Knowledge of assessment standards and strategic-level decision making.
Time Commitment	Up to 5 hours per month during fixed project term (6 months).	Variable commitment depending on TAP activity; typically, steady involvement across the year.
Duration	Fixed-term (e.g. Sept–March for each work cycle).	Ongoing (panel membership is not time-limited unless otherwise stated).
Format	Remote collaboration (Teams, SharePoint, email); fortnightly or ad-hoc meetings.	Formal scheduled remote meetings; quorum and voting procedures apply; Council secretariat support provided.
